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Recognition and approval of international standards under the Presidential Regulation 110/2025 enhances confidence among market participants.



- Provisions on carbon trading (i.e clause 65-69, 85) **formalize recognition of schemes under international standards (like Verra)** as non-SPE GRK certification and set the legal basis for cross-border/voluntary carbon market transactions.

- In the forestry sector, the mechanism being detailed under the Minister of Forestry Regulation No. 6 of 2026 on Forestry Sector Carbon Trading through GHG Emission Offsets, including the approval requirement for issuance



- On July 6th, the Ministry of Forestry approved 3 Indonesian VCS projects (i.e. Project 1477, 1899 and 3591) that have fulfilled all regulatory requirements for issuance



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Enabling interoperability between Indonesia's carbon registry and international registries would enhance transparency and improve access to international carbon markets.



- *New published Minister of Environment Regulation No. 10 of 2026 on SRUK allows interoperability with international standards*



- *Ongoing joint effort between Verra with KOMRAH, MoE and other agencies for interoperability, including exchange of technical data while maintaining coordination on the transition phase to preventing double claiming/counting*

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Evolving carbon standards allow market participants to improve project quality by adopting internationally recognized best practices. This positions projects to attract greater investment.



Integrity

- *Alignment with ICVCM - VCS program approved with 12+ ICVCM approved methodologies*
- *VCS 5.0 - embedding market-leading social and environmental safeguards*
- Third party validation/ verification process*



Compliance Markets and Convergence

- *In April 2026, Verra has published guidance documents for Article 6 and/or CORSIA labels to the credits they generate under the VCS Program, reflecting the latest decisions by the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)*
