Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Welcome to Barcelona and IETA's annual European Climate Summit (ECS)!

There are days when it feels as though the backdrop to our work has not changed much in the last year. When I welcomed you to Lisbon for ECS 2025, we spoke of geopolitical uncertainty, conflict and stubbornly high energy prices, and all that remains unfortunately true.

We're delighted to welcome a host of high-level experts to Barcelona, who'll share their insights and views on subjects ranging from urban decarbonisation to satellite monitoring technology, CBAM to CORSIA. We know you'll find something to interest you at ECS this year, and we look forward to the week's proceedings.

On behalf of IETA, we're grateful to our summit partners and sponsors for helping deliver this edition. We look forward to hearing your valuable insights and learning from each other.
